

#### Read Romans 3.22-26

But now apart from the law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—he did it to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus.

Why is important to understand that everyone of us, no matter who we are, have all fallen short?

Why is it also important to realize that everyone has the opportunity to be justified freely by His grace?

How does this truth express how Christ stands apart from all others?

How is understanding that "righteousness is given" different than thinking righteousness as something earned?

Why is it dangerous to fall into the trap of thinking that we can earn our own righteousness?

### **Big Idea**

Before we talk about the true story of the cross, we need to clear away some of the false stories that have likely crept into our minds and hearts. By ignoring these false stories, we run the risk of assuming we know what the cross is all about. But many of us have heard this story so many times that we have become inoculated to its meaning. By shining a light on the false stories, we can more fully appreciate the true story that the cross of Christ tells.
