Big Idea

This guide is based on this week's sermon in the series from Ephesians: Deep & Wide. Christ's love for us can sustain us in difficult times. Remember, Paul wrote Ephesians while he was in a prison. Some people struggle with feeling unloved or unloveable but Christ wants us to know that His rich love and know that we can come before God with faith and confidence.

Read Ephesians 3.14-19

For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

In his prayer for the Ephesians, Paul asked that they be established in love. How is love a like foundation on which every part of our life is built and effected?

In what way does love actually empower us to live like Christ intended?

How does the enemy try and convince us that we are not really loved?

What makes Christ's love different from the false imitations this wold tries to pass off as love?
