Dive In (10 Minutes)

Go around and let everyone share...

Have you ever been in a situation where you couldn't understand the language being spoken around you? How did that make you feel (isolated, confused, humbled)?

Dig Deep (40 Minutes)

Read Genesis 11:1-9 aloud.

- Look at verse 4. What were the three specific goals of the builders? Which of these do you think was their primary sin?
- Where do you think the “tower-building” idea came from? What is behind it?
- In verse 5, the author notes that the Lord "came down" to see what the humans were doing. Knowing that God is omnipresent and saw their hearts from the start, what is the author trying to communicate about the "greatness" of the tower compared to the actual magnitude of God?
- How did God’s response of confusing their language specifically target their ability to rebel against Him?

Do Big (10 Minutes)

- The builders wanted to "make a name for themselves." Where do you see this desire for legacy or reputation causing issues in our culture—or in your own life?
- The people had one language and one purpose, but it was used for the wrong ends. Is unity always a good thing? When can "teamwork" actually be dangerous?



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- Many scholars view the events of Pentecost (Acts 2) as a "Reverse Babel." At Babel, languages divided people; at Pentecost, languages united them in Christ. How does the Gospel bridge the barriers we still build today?
