Dive In (10 Minutes)

Go around and let everyone share...

If you had to move to a new city tomorrow without knowing the name of the city, your job title, or where you'd be living—but a person you trusted completely told you, "It'll be worth it"—would you go? What's the one thing you'd be most hesitant to leave behind?

Dig Deep (40 Minutes)

Read Genesis 12:1-9 aloud.

Read verses 1-3. God gives Abram a command followed by a massive promise.

- What three specific things did God tell Abram to leave? (v. 1)
- What is the "exchange rate" here? What does God promise to give Abram in return for what he leaves?

Look at verse 4. It simply says, *"So Abram went, as the Lord had told him."*

- Abram was 75 years old. Why does his age and the fact that he took his entire household (v. 5) make this move truly significant?
- There is no recorded "argument" from Abram here. What does this suggest about his view of God?

In verses 6-8, Abram travels through the land and stops at Shechem and Bethel.

- What does Abram do at each of these stops and why does he do it?

- In a culture without deeds or contracts, what was the significance of building an altar in a land that was currently occupied by Canaanites?

God tells Abram he will be blessed *so that* he can be a blessing to "all the peoples on earth."

- Do we often view God's blessings as a destination (for us to keep) or a pipeline (for us to pass through)?

Do Big (10 Minutes)

- How can our group better "bless" our specific community this week?
- What is one "comfort zone" you feel God is calling you to move out of right now so you can more clearly follow His lead?
